The book presents scholarship and research in a manner that meets the interests of students and

Public health is a term much used in the media, by health professionals, and by activists. In the way public health deals with healthy as well as sick people it is therefore a separate concept from health services, which deal with the sick population. Drawing on a wide range of international examples, Berridge demonstrates the central role of history to understanding the amorphous nature of public health today.
