In the first major study of
representations of World
War II in French crime
fiction, Margaret-Anne
Hutton draws on a corpus

situates her study within
the larger framework of
literary representations of
World War II, setting the

stage for her discussions
of genre; the problem of
defining crimes and

the war; the
epistemological issues
that arise in the
relationship between
World War II
historiography and the
crime novel; and the
temporal textures linking
past crimes to the
present. Filling a gap in
the fields of crime fiction
and fictional
representations of the
War, Hutton's book calls
into question the way
both crime fiction and the
French theatre of World
War II have been
conceptualized and
codified.

Lonard Bourdon: The
Career of a Revolutionary,
1754-1807 illustrates the
ways in which one
individual was affected by
and influenced the long
and turbulent course of
the French Revolution. It
also rescues an active,
intelligent and interesting
man from a prolonged
period of scholarly neglect

and redeems his
reputation from being
perceived as a particularly

terrorist. Sydenham
follows Bourdon's political
career from the final days
of the old monarchy
through Bourdon's active

Revolution. Bourdon was
always aware that
political development
must be accompanied by
educational change, and
his lifelong interest in
education is an integral
part of his story. Bourdon
left remarkably few
personal papers. During
the painstaking
exploration for details of
his life, several critical as
well as unfamiliar events
of the period have been
illuminated, suggesting
that similar
misrepresentations of
many other relatively
unknown French
revolutionaries have
distorted current
understanding of this
period, crucial to the
growth and development
of modern democracy.

 All societies are constructed, based on specific rules, norms, and laws. Hence, all ethics and morality are predicated on perceived right or wrong behavior, and much of human culture proves to be the result of a larger discourse on vices and virtues, transgression and ideals, right and wrong. The topics covered in this volume, addressing fundamental concerns of the premodern world, deal with allegedly criminal, or simply wrong behavior which demanded punishment. Sometimes this affected whole groups of people, such as the innocently persecuted Jews, sometimes individuals, such as violent and evil princes. The issue at stake here embraces all of society since it can only survive if a general framework is observed that is based in some way on justice and peace. But literature and the visual arts provide many examples of open and public protests against wrongdoings, ill-conceived ideas and concepts, and stark crimes, such as theft, rape, and murder. In fact, poetic statements or paintings could carry significant potentials against those who

deliberately transgressed moral and ethical norms, or who even targeted themselves.

 In *Between the Queen and the Cabby*, John Cole provides the first full translation of de Gouges's *Rights of Woman* and the first systematic commentary on its declaration, its attempt to envision a non-marital partnership agreement, and its support for persons of colour. Cole compares and contrasts de Gouges's two texts, explaining how the original text was both her model and her foil. By adding a proposed marriage contract to her pamphlet, she sought to turn the ideas of the French Revolution into a concrete way of life for women. Further examination of her work as a playwright suggests that she supported equality not only for women but for slaves as well. Cole highlights the historical context of de Gouges's writing, going beyond the inherent sexism and misogyny of the time in exploring why her work did not receive the reaction or achieve the influential status she had hoped for. isolation in the gender-conscious twenty-first century, de Gouges's Rights of Woman may seem ordinary. However, none of her contemporaries, neither the Marquis de Condorcet nor Mary Wollstonecraft, published more widely on current affairs, so boldly attempted to extend democratic principles to women, or so clearly related the public and private spheres. King Henry III of France has not suffered well at the hands of posterity. Generally depicted as at best a self-indulgent, ineffectual ruler, and at worst a debauched tyrant responsible for a series of catastrophic political blunders, his reputation has long been a poor one. Yet recent scholarship has begun to question the validity of this judgment and look for a more rounded assessment of the man and his reign. For, as this new biography

of Henry demonstrates, there is far more to this fascinating monarch than the pantomime villain depicted by previous generations of historians and novelists. Based upon a rich and diverse range of primary sources, this book traces Henry's life from his birth in 1551, the sixth child of Henri II and Catherine de' Medici.
