connections among his beliefs, his feelings, and his life. More than a "behind-the-scenes look at the private life of a public man," Kelly writes, "the Confessions is at the center of Rousseau's philosophical enterprise."

Helen Dauvray was a popular actress, not a sportswriter, but her profound influence on baseball history warrants her inclusion in the Sports She Wrote series. Despite authoring only a handful of articles herself, she is often quoted extensively in the 340 articles (104,000 words) in this volume. Her theatrical stardom captivated the sports world's attention through her highly publicized lifestyle and relationships, shaping the sporting landscape in fundamental ways. Helen's sponsorship of the Dauvray Cup inspired the first interleague championship in major league baseball history, the individual medals she offered to the players on the winning team set a precedent for the coveted championship rings of modern times, and her pivotal role in the formation of post-season competition highlights her enduring legacy to the national pastime. Articles in this volume span from her childhood stardom on stage in the 1860s until her death in 1923. The centerpiece of her connection to baseball is her tumultuous marriage to baseball superstar John Montgomery Ward in 1887, a future Hall of Famer and founder of the first players' union in professional sports. The intersection of Helen's business experiences running a theatrical company and her husband's involvement in the business aspects of baseball sheds light on her extraordinary life and contributions to American culture. Her marriage to Ward bridged the worlds of sports and

entertainment, leading to a convergence of power struggles and media scrutiny familiar to celebrity couples today. Their relationship, marked by personal and professional conflicts, mirrored the tensions within the baseball world during a transformative period. Dauvray's alleged involvement in the formation and demise of the Players' League, a breakaway major league spearheaded by her husband, further underscores her influence on baseball's evolution. The appendices in this volume detail Ward's role in the formation of the Players' League, the first challenge to the infamous Reserve Clause instituted by the owners of professional baseball teams, and also the convergence of the despicable Color Line drawn in 1887 which prohibited men of color from competing in major league baseball for the ensuing 60 years. The season of 1887 was notable for other reasons, including rule changes regarding balls and strikes (it was the only year in baseball history in which batters were permitted four strikes!). With a multitude of simultaneous storylines which otherwise may confuse the reader, each chronological article is visually labeled with graphical icons denoting the relevant topics. A star symbol indicates theatrical relevance, a baseball icon for baseball-related material, a dollar sign for financial matters, and several other icons that are identified within the book. Her story includes a stalker, a prize Mexican hairless dog, sexual assault allegations against her brother, a notorious ex-husband, allegations of infidelity involving Ward, and other salacious events ready-made for juicy headlines. Despite the controversy and gossip surrounding her, Helen Dauvray's impact on post-season championships, player unions, and the broader landscape of professional baseball remains undeniable. Baseball fans

interested in more in-depth coverage of the Players' League, which was a third major league that only existed during the season of 1890, are encouraged to read the Sports She Wrote volume: Ella Black, *The First Woman Baseball Correspondent*. Sports She Wrote is a 31-volume time-capsule of primary documents written by more than 500 women in the 19th century.

Among the notable books of later times—we may say, without exaggeration, of all time—must be reckoned *The Confessions of Jean Jacques Rousseau*. It deals with leading personages and transactions of a momentous epoch, when absolutism and feudalism were rallying for their last struggle against the modern spirit, chiefly represented by Voltaire, the Encyclopedists, and Rousseau himself—a struggle to which, after many fierce intestine quarrels and sanguinary wars throughout Europe and America, has succeeded the prevalence of those more tolerant and rational principles by which the statesmen of our own day are actuated. On these matters, however, it is not our province to enlarge; nor is it necessary to furnish any detailed account of our author's political, religious, and philosophic axioms and systems, his paradoxes and his errors in logic: these have been so long

and so exhaustively disputed over by contending factions that little is left for even the most assiduous gleaner in the field. The inquirer will find, in Mr. John Money's excellent work, the opinions of Rousseau reviewed succinctly and impartially. The 'Contrat Social', the 'Lettres Ecrites de la Montagne', and other treatises that once aroused fierce controversy, may therefore be left in the repose to which they have long been consigned, so far as the mass of mankind is concerned, though they must always form part of the library of the politician and the historian. One prefers to turn to the man Rousseau as he paints himself in the remarkable work before us. That the task which he undertook in offering to show himself—as Persius puts it—'Intus et in cute', to posterity, exceeded his powers, is a trite criticism; like all human enterprises, his purpose was only imperfectly fulfilled; but this circumstance in no way lessens the attractive qualities of his book, not only for the student of history or psychology, but for the intelligent man of the world.

In 1945 some experts still considered the so-called sound barrier an impenetrable wall, while winged rocket planes remained largely relegated to science fiction. But soon a series of unique rocket-powered research aircraft and the dedicated individuals who built, maintained, and flew them began to push the boundaries of flight in aviation's quest to move ever higher, ever faster, toward the unknown. *Beyond Blue Skies* examines the thirty-year period after World War II during which aviation experienced an unprecedented era of progress that led the United States to the boundaries of outer space. Between 1946

The role of not only the test pilots but the engineers, aerodynamicists, and support staff in making supersonic flight possible has been widely overlooked. *Beyond Blue Skies* charts the triumphs and tragedies of the rocket-plane era and the unsung efforts of the men and women who made amazing achievements possible.
