The Body of the Beasts

Michael Onfray
passionately defends the
potential of hedonism to
resolve the dislocations
and disconnections of our
melancholy age. In a
sweeping survey of

history's engagement with
and rejection of the body,
he exposes the sterile
conventions that prevent
us from realizing a more
immediate, ethical, and
embodied life. He then
lays the groundwork for
both a radical and
constructive politics of the
body that adds to debates
over morality, equality,
sexual relations, and
social engagement,

demonstrating how
philosophy, and not just
modern scientism, can
contribute to a humanistic
ethics. Onfray attacks
Platonic idealism and its
manifestation in Judaic,
Christian, and Islamic
belief. He warns of the
lure of attachment to the
purportedly eternal,
immutable truths of
idealism, which detracts
from the immediacy of

the world and our bodily existence. Insisting that philosophy is a practice that operates in a real, material space, Onfray enlists Epicurus and Democritus to undermine idealist and theological metaphysics; Nietzsche, Bentham, and Mill to dismantle idealist ethics; and Palante and Bourdieu to collapse crypto-fascist neoliberalism. In their place, he constructs a positive, hedonistic ethics that enlarges on the work of the New Atheists to promote a joyful approach to our lives in this, our

only, world.

In this frank and unforgettable book, celebrated Québécois writer Alexie Morin becomes the subject of her own story as she places a childhood friendship under a microscope. An autobiographical novel set in a small industrial town in Quebec during the 1990s, *Open Your Heart* recounts the story of a difficult friendship between two girls brought together by illness and operations suffered at a

young age. One girl suffers from severe strabismus, while the other was born blue. The first, defiant, feels that something is wrong with her, while the second is an angelic child loved by all. One becomes a writer, and the other dies at eighteen, during an operation that should have saved her life. In this debut novel, Morin stakes out an exceptional pursuit for truth in these old memories as she grapples with death, love, bonding and solitude.

Jean Grondin completes the first history of metaphysics and respects both the analytical and the Continental schools while transcending the theoretical limitations of each. He reviews seminal texts by Parmenides, Plato, Aristotle, Plotinus, and Augustine. He follows the theological turn in the metaphysical thought of Avicenna, Anselm, Aquinas, and Duns Scotus, and he revisits Descartes and the cogito; Spinoza and Leibniz's rationalist approaches;

Kant's reclaiming of the metaphysical tradition; and post-Kantian practice up to Hegel. He engages with twentieth century innovations that upended the discipline, particularly Heidegger's revival of the question of Being and the rediscovery of the metaphysics of existence by Sartre and the Existentialists, language by Gadamer and Derrida, and transcendence by Levinas. Metaphysics is often dismissed as a form or epoch of philosophy that must be overcome, yet by promoting a full

understanding of its platform and processes, Grondin reveals its cogent approach to reality and foundational influence on modern philosophy and science. By restoring the value of metaphysics for contemporary audiences, Grondin showcases the rich currents and countercurrents of metaphysical thought and its future possibilities. Patisserie Step by Step Simon and Schuster In this delightful little volume, Honoré de Balzac, the renowned 19th century French

novelist and playwright, takes readers on a short fantasy journey to the mystical island of Java where he - or rather the narrator - encounters a deadly poison-breathing tree, civilized monkeys, a love-sick sparrow, and the epitome of Oriental desirability of the day - the women of Java.

The Inquisitory consists entirely of the interrogation of an old, deaf servant regarding unspecified crimes that

may or may not have taken place at his master's French chateau. The servant's replies - which are by turns comic, straightforward, angry, nostalgic, and disingenuous - hint at a variety of seedy events, including murder, orgies, tax fraud, and drug deals. Of course, the servant wasn't involved with any of these activities - if the reader chooses to believe him. In trying to convince the inquisitor of his innocence, the servant creates a web of half-truths, vague references,

and glaring inconsistencies amid "forgotten" details, indicating that he may know more than he's letting on.

Paulhan's seminal work in English for the first time *Les Fleurs de Tarbes, ou la terreur dans les lettres*, first published as a single volume in 1941, was considered by Jean Paulhan to be the furthest-reaching expression of his thinking about literature and

language. It is now recognized as a landmark text in the history of twentieth century literary criticism and in the emergence of contemporary literary theory. This is the first time it has been translated into English. The playful tone and quirky, casual style of Paulhan's writing mask a theoretical intent and seriousness of purpose that are extraordinarily prescient. In *The Flowers of Tarbes* Paulhan probes the relationship between language, meaning,

context, intention and action with unremitting tenacity, and in so doing produces a major treatise on the nature of the literary act, and a meditation on what we might now call the responsibility or ethical imperative of literature itself.

incidents for both a YA and adult audience. It is original, sincere, captivating, and a little bit retro.
