Beginning with Mario Bava's *The Girl Who Knew Too Much* (1963) and Dario Argento's *The Bird with the Crystal Plumage* (1970), giallo films influenced the American slasher films of the 1980s and attracted an increasingly large fandom. In *Bloodstained Narratives: The Giallo Film in Italy and Abroad*, contributors explore understudied aspects of gialli. The chapters introduce readers to a wide range of films, including masterpieces from Argento and overlooked gems, all of them examined in close detail. Rather than understanding giallo as focalized exclusively in Italy in the 1970s, this collection explores the extension of gialli narratives abroad through different geographies and times. This book examines Italian gialli of the 1970s as well as American neo-gialli, French productions, Canadian horror films of the 1980s, and Asian rewritings of this "yellow" cycle of crime/horror films. *Bloodstained Narratives* also features interviews with two giallo film directors, including cult favorite Antonio Bido. Rather than fading from the cinematic stage, gialli serves as a precursor and steady accomplice to horror-thriller films through the twenty-first century.

Annotated by OWFoundation with a biography of Agatha Christie *The Murder on the Links* is a work of detective fiction by Agatha Christie, first published in the US by Dodd, Mead & Co in the same year. and in the UK by The Bodley Head in May 1923, It features Hercule Poirot and Arthur Hastings. The UK edition retailed at seven shillings and sixpence (7/6), and the US edition at \$1.75. The story takes place in northern France, giving Poirot a hostile competitor from the Paris Sûreté. Poirot's long memory for past or similar crimes proves useful in resolving the crimes. The book is notable for a subplot in which Hastings falls in love, a development "greatly desired on Agatha's part... parcelling off Hastings to wedded bliss in the Argentine. Reviews when it was published compared Mrs Christie favourably to Arthur Conan Doyle in his Sherlock Holmes mysteries. Remarking on Poirot, still a new character, one reviewer said he was "a pleasant contrast to most of his lurid competitors; and one even suspects a touch of satire in him."

Murder State AuthorHouse

In the second half of the nineteenth century, the Euro-American citizenry of California carried out mass genocide against the Native population of their state, using the processes and mechanisms of democracy to secure land and resources for themselves and their private interests. The murder, rape, and enslavement of thousands of Native people were legitimized by notions of democracy—in this case mob rule—through a discreetly organized and brutally effective series of petitions, referenda, town hall meetings, and votes at every level of California government. *Murder State* is a comprehensive examination of these events and their early legacy.

Preconceptions about Native Americans as shaped by the popular press and by immigrants' experiences on the overland trail to California were used to further justify the elimination of Native people in the newcomers' quest for land. The allegedly "violent nature" of Native people was often merely their reaction to the atrocities committed against them as they were driven from their ancestral lands and alienated from their traditional resources. In this narrative history employing numerous primary sources and the latest interdisciplinary scholarship on genocide, Brendan C. Lindsay examines the darker side of California history, one that is rarely studied in detail, and the motives of both Native Americans and Euro-Americans at the time. *Murder State* calls attention to the misuse of democracy to justify and commit genocide.

Il racconto, scritto nello stile giornalistico dell'epoca e pubblicato a puntate, a partire dal febbraio 1897, sul settimanale *To-Day* diretto dall'umorista Jerome K. Jerome, terrorizzò a tal punto i londinesi che viaggiavano in metropolitana che dopo la quarta puntata la società dei trasporti scrisse una formale lettera di protesta al giornale. Restio a interrompere la pubblicazione visto l'enorme incremento delle vendite, Jerome decise di consultarsi col suo direttore amministrativo, William Alfred Dunkerley. Questi, che era un ex droghiere di Manchester amante della carta stampata, lo convinse a pubblicare altri tre episodi. Solo due anni dopo Jerome avrebbe scoperto che l'autore era lo stesso Dunkerley e non, come aveva creduto, un anonimo scrittore che inviava i pezzi dalla Scozia. La grande popolarità del racconto diede la fama a Oxenham/Dunkerley che nei successivi quarant'anni produsse più di trenta romanzi e diversi libri di poesia e di soggetto religioso.

This book provides a fascinating analysis of a single jurisdiction, Brazil, and accounts for both the successes and the failures of its most recent constitutional project, inaugurated by the Constitution of 1988. It sets out the following aspects of the constitutional development and erosion: - the different phases of the promised transition from military rule to a 'social-democratic constitutionalism'; - the obstacles to democratisation derived from the absence of true institutional reforms in the judicial branch and in the civil-military relationship; - the legal and social practices which maintained a structure that obstructed the emergence of an effective social-democracy, such as the neoliberal pattern, the acceptance in the political field of unlawful organisations, such as the *milícias*, and the way the digital revolution has been harming the formation of democratic sovereignty. Situating Brazil in the global context of the revival of authoritarianism, it details the factors which are common to the third wave of democratisation reflux. Accounting for those aspects, particular to the Brazilian jurisdiction, it shows that there is a tension in the Brazilian constitution. On the one hand, such constitutionalism was renewed by democratic pressure on governments to undertake social politics since 1988. On the other hand, it retained authoritarian practices through the hands of diverse institutions and political actors. By exploring the ideas of constitutional erosion and collapse, as well as democratic, social and digital constitutionalism, the book presents a comparative analysis of Brazil and other jurisdictions, including the United States, South Africa, and Peru.
