The stereotype of the woman missionary has ranged from that of the long-suffering wife, characterized by the epitaph "Died, given over to hospitality, to that of the spinster in her unstylish dress and wire-rimmed glasses, alone somewhere for thirty years teaching heathen children. Like all caricatures, those of the exhausted wife and frustrated old maid carry some truth: the underlying message of the stereotypes is that missionary women were perceived as marginal to the central tasks of mission. Rather than being remembered for preaching the gospel, the quintessential male task, missionary women were noted for meeting human needs and helping others, sacrificing themselves without plan or reason, all for the sake of bringing the world to Jesus Christ. Historical evidence, however, gives lie to the truism that women missionaries were and are doers but not thinkers, reactive secondary figures rather than proactive primary ones. The first American women to serve as foreign missionaries in 1812 were among the best-educated women of their time. Although barred from obtaining the college education or ministerial credentials of their husbands, the early missionary wives had read their Jonathan Edwards and Samuel Hopkins. Not only did they go abroad with particular theologies to share, but their identities as women caused them to develop gender-based mission theories. Early nineteenth-century women seldom wrote theologies of mission, but they wrote letters and kept journals that reveal a thought world and set of assumptions about women's roles in the missionary task. The activities of missionary wives were not random: they were part of a mission strategy that gave women a particular role in the advancement of the reign of God. By moving from mission field to mission field in chronological order of missionary presence, Robert charts missiological developments as they took place in dialogue with the urgent context of the day. Each case study marks the beginning of the mission theory. Baptist women in Burma, for example, are only considered in their first decades there and are not traced into the present. Robert believes that at this early stage of research into women's mission theory, integrity and analysis lies more in a succession of contextualized case studies than in gross generalizations.

Presentations at the Lausanne Congress in 1974 sparked an ongoing dialogue among world missions leaders about the prioritization of future ministry resources with regard to frontier missions. Ultimately, Assemblies of God World Missions United States (AGWM) leadership fully embraced the prioritization of frontier missions, making it one of three major emphases of the Movement. In light of this development, research must happen to determine how this initiative has impacted the manner in which local Assemblies of God (AG) pastors make decisions about the vision and praxis of missions in their local churches. The national missions committee of AGWM conducted nationwide in-depth interviews with forty-five pastors varying in age, size of church, and ethnicity in order to begin answering this question among others. These interviews provide a basis for Q-sorting research with the Mississippi pastors in order to gain more localized information of greater detail. Taking into account the historical, theological, and missiological context around the issue of frontier missions, this project seeks to discover shared points of view among pastors of the Mississippi District of the Assemblies of God (MDAG) about missions priorities, with a special emphasis on whether those views include frontier missions. A review of the biblical, theological, and missiological literature will reveal how each informs the proper role of frontier missions in the landscape of missions priorities. A historical review of AG world missions will provide background

for evaluating the priority of reaching the least reached in the history of the Movement. The results of the Q-sort will provide a clear picture of the MDAG pastor's motivations concerning missions ministry. The study of the Scriptures, AG missions history, and contemporary missiology will yield a basis for evaluating their missions worldview with regards to frontier missions.
