This model emphasized that writers' motivational beliefs influence how and what they write. Likewise, increased attention has been devoted in recent years to how teachers' motivational beliefs about writing, especially their efficacy to teach writing, impact how writing is taught and how students' progress as writers. As a result, there is a need to bring together, in a Research Topic, studies that examine the role and influence of writing beliefs. Historically, the psychological study of writing has focused on what students' write or the processes they apply when writing.
