Der Ortschronist ist häufig eine Person, die sich freiwillig und ehrenamtlich, aus Heimatliebe für die geschichtlichen Vorgänge in seinem Ort interessiert und diese zeitrichtig aufschreibt, die Schätze der Ortsgeschichte sammelt und aufbewahrt. Hierzu gehören auch Befragungen von Zeitzeugen und das Herstellen von Kontakten für Akteure des Dorflebens. Oft sind es Lehrer, die ihre Arbeit durch diese Aufgabe erweitern, aber es ist unausbleiblich, dass sie ihre eigene Sicht der Dinge haben, also ihren persönlichen Eindruck vermitteln. Damit stehen sie nicht selten im Konflikt mit den Anforderungen an Objektivität und Rückverfolgbarkeit ihrer Erzählungen, denn für den Wert bei den Nutzern im sich darin Einordnen und für den Aufbau einer Regionalgeschichte müssen gewisse Voraussetzungen gegeben sein. Im vorliegenden Fall ergibt sich, dass ein Arbeitsergebnis eines Ortschronisten vorliegt und gleichzeitig mehrere Forschungsergebnisse eines an wissenschaftliche Arbeit beim Recherchieren gewöhnten und derart im Berufsleben Tätigen. Durch eine Komplementierung mit thematischer Methodik beider Quellenwerke kann eine Ortsgeschichte das Verständnis des traditionellen Erbes verbessern und den Blick erweitern, z.B. auf die Grenzen des eigenen Einflusses auf das Dorfleben. Aus dem Themenkomplex wurden die Einschnitte in die dörfliche Existenz in Not- und Kriegszeiten beleuchtet und die Empfindlichkeit des agrarischen Landes gegenüber katastrophalen Wetterereignissen relativiert. Dies ist auch notwendig, wenn verschiedene Ortschroniken in eine regionale Betrachtung einfließen, wenn die Sichtweisen abgeglichen und die Dörfer auch in ihrer geschichtlichen Vergangenheit bei den funktionalen Planungen wie der Energieversorgung, des Tourismus usw. beachtet werden sollen, wenn etwas harmonisch zusammenwachsen soll. Art and Architecture in Central Europe 1550-1620

In *Across the German Sea: Early Modern Scottish Connections with the Wider Elbe-Weser Region* Zickermann analyses the commercial, maritime and military relations between Scotland and the German cities (Hamburg, Bremen) and territories (Bremen and Verden, Holstein, Braunschweig-Lüneburg) located alongside the lower parts of the rivers Elbe and Weser. Based on a wealth of British, German and Scandinavian archival material, the study demonstrates the importance of the region for Scottish commodity exchange and network building across political borders, whilst contributing significantly to our understanding of the formation of Scottish communities abroad. It also shows that Scottish commercial, political, military and religious activities within the region - which featured a Danish-Norwegian and Swedish dimension - were intertwined and cannot be studied in

isolation.

Vaccination Is Not Immunization

Austrian writer and peace activist Bertha von Suttner was the first woman to win the Nobel Peace Prize. As founder of the Austrian and German Peace Associations and the author of a number of novels and several works on peace, von Suttner's name became synonymous worldwide with peace activism and protest against old world order. Ironically, her death eight days before the outbreak of World War I was seen by her contemporaries as a symbolic end of the possibility for world peace. In *Bertha von Suttner*, Brigitte Hamann has written the most comprehensive biography of the celebrated journalist - translated into English by Ann Dubsy - tracing not only von Suttner's life and work but spanning the political and social frontier of Austria on the eve of World War I. Von Suttner's novel *Die Waffen Nieder!* (Lay Down Your Arms!), published in 1899, was a bestseller and brought her international acclaim. Indeed, Tolstoy compared her technique of rallying readers to her cause to that of Harriet Beecher Stowe in *Uncle Tom's Cabin* for the emancipation of American slaves. Her lectures on peace and disarmament took her throughout Europe and the United States, where she formed close friendships with Andrew Carnegie, Alfred Nobel, Theodor Herzl, and Albert I of Monaco. As her conviction to initiate peace movements deepened, so her books became more impassioned. Her dictum, "universal sisterhood is necessary before the universal brotherhood is possible", demonstrated that her concerns extended beyond the peace movement to include women's issues and many social causes, making von Suttner's work quite relevant at the close of the twentieth century.
