General health and social care professionals give day-to-day palliative care to people as part of their roles.

Hospice care
Hospice care is provided by a specialist unit run by a team of doctors, nurses, social workers, counsellors and trained volunteers. Hospice care can take place in your own home, as an inpatient at a hospice or as a day patient visiting the hospice. Read more about hospice care.

If you choose to receive care at home, in a care home or in a hospice, you should be assessed for NHS continuing care. Continuing care is professional care given to meet the physical or mental health needs of adults with a disability, injury or illness over an extended period of time. NHS continuing healthcare means a package of care that is arranged and funded by the NHS, and is free of charge to the person receiving the care.
