Papers presented at the Fifteenth International Conference on Patristic Studies held in Oxford 2007 (see also *Studia Patristica* 44, 45, 47, 48

and 49). The successive sets of *Studia Patristica* contain papers delivered at the International Conferences on Patristic Studies, which meet for a week once every four years in Oxford; they are held under the aegis of the Theology Faculty of the University. Members of these conferences come from all over the world and most offer papers. These range over the whole field, both East and West, from the second century to a section on the *Nachleben* of the Fathers. The

majority are short papers dealing with some small and manageable point; they raise and sometimes resolve questions about the authenticity of documents, dates of events, and such like, and some unveil new texts. The smaller number of longer papers put such matters into context and indicate wider trends. The whole reflects the state of Patristic scholarship and demonstrates the vigour and popularity of the subject.

concile de Latran (1215), le manuel de base de la théologie des universités du XIIIe au XVe siècle c'est dire son importance. Leur enseignement se fonde sur la théologie de saint Augustin, autour de laquelle sont rassemblés les Pères (Ambroise, Jérôme, Hilaire, etc.) et les maîtres (Hugues de Saint-Victor, Pierre Abélard, Gilbert de Poitiers, etc.) ; la théologie orientale y est représentée, pour l'essentiel, par « La Foi orthodoxe » de Jean Damascène. Cette oeuvre de Pierre Lombard est un

moment caractéristique de l'histoire de la pensée. Over the last decade, Yan Lianke has been continually heralded as one of the “best contemporary Chinese

writers” (The Independent) and “one of the country’s fiercest satirists” (The Guardian). Among many awards and honors, he has been twice a finalist for the Man Booker International Prize and he was awarded the prestigious Franz Kafka Prize for his impressive body of work. Now, for the first time, his two most acclaimed novellas are being published in English. “Timeless” and “marvelous” (Asian Review of Books), Marrow is a haunting story of a widow who goes to

extremes to provide a normal life for her four physically and mentally disabled children. Comparisons and Contrasts collects eleven of Richard Kayne's recent articles in theoretical syntax, with an emphasis on comparative syntax, which uses syntactic differences among languages to probe the properties of the human language faculty. Kayne attaches particular

importance to uncovering the primitives of syntax/semantics, demonstrating the existence of silent elements that are syntactically and semantically active, and showing their distribution and limitations. He attempts to derive the very existence of the noun-verb distinction-and to account for the sharp differences between nouns and verbs and for the lack of parallelism between them—from the antisymmetric character of syntax. The common

theme is an exploration of how wide a range of questions the field of syntax can reasonably attempt to ask and then answer. Comparisons and Contrasts will appeal to scholars and graduate students interested in syntax, semantics, and their effects on other areas of linguistics.
