Pourquoi les enseignants sont-ils  
persuadés que certaines pratiques valent  
mieux que d'autres ? Pourquoi critiquent-  
ils, voire refusent-ils, certaines pratiques,  
dont l'efficacité a (parfois) été démontrée  
par la recherche ? Les articles ici réunis  
proposent d'interroger ensemble pratiques  
et croyances des enseignants dans dix

systèmes scolaires et contextes  
socioculturels contrastés. Si le dossier met  
d'abord en lumière la diversité des  
acceptions de ces deux termes, il  
interroge surtout le changement en  
éducation et les dilemmes que celui-ci  
soulève, entre acceptation des consignes  
institutionnelles et expertise  
professionnelle issue de la pratique. Aux  
États-Unis, dans les no excuses charter  
schools, des règles locales strictes  
empêchent les enseignants de mettre en  
œuvre des pratiques qu'ils jugent plus  
efficaces. En Corée du Sud, malgré

d'excellents résultats aux tests PISA,  
certains enseignants se montrent critiques  
à l'égard des standards nationaux qui leur  
semblent parfois passer à côté d'une  
réelle réussite scolaire pour les élèves. En  
Tunisie, les directives officielles, en  
assurant l'unicité du système éducatif, ne  
risquent-elles pas de sacrifier l'implication  
des enseignants et de remettre en  
question l'idéal libérateur de l'école ? Au  
Brésil, la défiance vis-à-vis des politiques  
éducatives actuelles peut apparaître  
comme le seul recours des enseignants  
pour mettre en œuvre des méthodes en

lesquelles ils croient, respectueuses des élèves et des principes démocratiques. Si, en Afrique de l'Ouest, il existe un écart entre les croyances des enseignants et celles des élites politiques, la défiance des enseignants vis-à-vis des politiques publiques peut aussi consolider les liens de solidarité entre eux, comme en Amérique du Nord, et notamment au Québec. De même, en France, les enseignants, en dépit d'un « malaise » régulièrement évoqué, croient fortement en leur utilité vis-à-vis des élèves, éprouvée par la pratique. Dès lors, dans les efforts faits pour amener les enseignants à modifier leurs croyances, puis leurs pratiques, certaines actions de formation peuvent-elles s'avérer plus efficaces que d'autres ? Des recherches menées en Suisse, en Pologne et en Belgique plaident en ce sens, preuve que les actions engagées ne restent pas sans effet. Un numéro coordonné par Géraldine Farges, université de Bourgogne /IREDU *Numismatic Chronicle, and Journal of the Royal Numismatic Society* BRILL Philippe Apeloig (1962) has established his reputation in the international poster scene since the end of the 1980s with

works of a rare constant quality and an unerring sense for what it takes to design a poster. His work, above all that with an explicitly cultural content, is well represented in the major collections. Since his death in 1994 (when he put a bullet through his heart in his lonely farmhouse) Guy Debord has been hailed as one of the key thinkers of the age. In Britain and the United States, his theories on the 'spectacle' of modern life were

simultaneously hailed as deadly truths by underground subversives and accorded the highest academic prestige. In the same way, the Situationist International (SI), a volatile group of artists, revolutionaries and intellectuals which he led through the 1950s and 1960s, is considered to be the most important art movement since Dada and the Surrealists. Debord himself was a welter of contradictions, whose public life was entirely predicated upon the singlemindedness of his revolutionary intentions, but who privately sought oblivion in infamy, exile and alcoholism. Implicated in the events of May 1968, Italian terrorism and the murder of his friends, and under surveillance by the French secret police for over a decade, he mixed in elite art, business and political circles, and has had admirers and devotees of all political colours and ranks. This biography is an appraisal of a lone and defiant figure whose story follows and, at one historic moment in 1968, appears to lead the drift of art and politics in post-war Paris. 'It could almost be believed that I was the only person to have loved Paris,' Debord said. Then, almost with a shrug,

'but no one has twice raised Paris to revolt.'

In the nineteenth century France became fixated on infant sleep. Pictures of sleeping babies proliferated in paintings, posters, and advertisements for cradles and toys. Childcare manuals and medical writings insisted on the importance of

sleep as a measure of a child's future health and vigour. Infant sleep was transformed from an unremarkable event to a precarious stage of life that demanded monitoring, support, and, above all, the constant presence and attention of mothers. *Hush Little Baby* uncovers the cultural, medical, and economic forces that came to shape Western ideas about infants' sleeping patterns, rituals, and settings. By the mid-nineteenth century doctors were advising that infant sleep should be carefully controlled by caregivers according to medical guidelines, and that to do otherwise would risk compromising a child's development. A sleeping baby was

seen as the sign of a good mother – an idea that was reinforced through countless pictures of mothers watching vigilantly over their sleeping children, even as the reality of postpartum depression was known to doctors. The medical advice literature also helped to create a commercial infant industry, encouraging the production of clothing, bedding, cradles, and accessories designed to foster sleep, and providing new ways for families to demonstrate social status. In *Hush Little Baby* Gal Ventura shows how these images and ideas about babies' sleep created many of the standards and expectations that keep parents awake today.
