This is very similar to Chinese language, which contains Radical. Radicals normally give you some hints in meaning. By decoding the root words from Latin and Greek, you will find most deep words such as biology and medical term are easier to remember, you can even sense out a new word meaning even it is new to you or it is even French, German or Italian.
