Walter Benjamin's idea of the optical

was interested in how visual media

invention of the camera allowed us to  
see images and details that we could not  
consciously perceive before. This study

concerned with how acoustical media

to the naked ear. Crucially, they help  
sensitize us to the discursive sonority of  
words, which Benjamin was already

Tieck's *Blonde Eckbert*, which Benjamin  
once called his locus classicus of his  
theory of forgetting, to Alexander  
Kluge's films and short texts, where he  
develops what he calls "sound

our understanding of different media,  
from the written word to radio and film.

The book's central proposition is that the prominent feature of the hieroglyphic script which Egyptologists call "determinatives" makes up an elaborate system of classifiers. All items of the lexicon take motivated pictorial classifiers. By this device, the script reflects the map of knowledge organization of ancient Egyptian culture. The book aims to reveal the principles and constraints governing the codification of the ancient Egyptian universe in this system. There is, to date, no comprehensive study, either in Egyptology or in cognitive linguistics, of the hieroglyphic classifiers as a structured system. The present work attempts to fill the existing hiatus by bridging the disciplines of Egyptology and cognitive studies, using the tools of the latter to elucidate the former and thus perhaps arrive at new perspectives on both. From the Egyptological angle, the book deals with the ancient Egyptians' nomenclature for "items in the world" and the relationship between lexicon and the knowledge organization. However, the events occurring in the picture-script render cognitive processes visible to our inspection hundreds of years before they have ripened into the Egyptian language. This "visibility" bears

directly on a number of crucial questions in cognitive linguistics and ethnobiology. The book also includes an introduction to the hieroglyphic script.

For over a century, Karl Marx's critique of capitalism has been a crucial resource for social movements. What does it mean to be religious believers for people whose living conditions are defined by an increasingly secularized environment? Is the common distinction between faith and knowledge valid? In *Inconceivable Effects*, Martin Blumenthal-Barby reads theoretical, literary and cinematic works that appear noteworthy for the ethical questions they raise.
