 Florence were so renowned for sodomy
 that "Florenzer" in German meant
 "sodomite." In the late fifteenth century,
 as many as one in two Florentine men had
 come to the attention of the authorities for
 sodomy by the time they were thirty. In
 1432 The Office of the Night was created
 specifically to police sodomy in Florence.
 Indeed, nearly all Florentine males
 probably had some kind of same-sex

experience as a part of their "normal"
 sexual life. Seventy years of
 denunciations, interrogations, and
 sentencings left an extraordinarily detailed
 record, which author Michael Rocke has
 used in his vivid depiction of this vibrant
 sexual culture in a world where these
 same-sex acts were not the deviant
 transgressions of a small minority, but an

 identity. Rocke roots this sexual activity in
 the broader context of Renaissance
 Florence, with its social networks of
 families, juvenile gangs, neighbors,
 patronage, workshops, and confraternities,
 and its busy political life from the early
 years of the Republic through the period of
 Lorenzo de' Medici, Savonarola, and the
 beginning of Medici princely rule. His richly

 of Renaissance Florence and calls into

question our modern conceptions of
 gender and sexual identity.

The social historian, searching for the basis of a culture, often turns to a study of ordinary people. Perhaps one of the most revealing places to find them is in a court of law. In this presentatoin of nine criminal trials of sixteenth-century Rome (1540-75), where magistrates kept verbatim records, Thomas and Elizabeth Cohen paint a lively portrait of a society, one that is reminiscent of Boccaccio.

These stories, however, are true. Each trial transcript is followed by an essay that interprets the beliefs, codes, everyday speech, and personal transactions of a world that is radically different from our own. The people on trial include assassins, a spell-caster, an exorcist, an adulterous wife, several courtesans, and the peasant cast of a bawdy, sacrilegious play. Out of their often pognant troubles, and their machinations, comes a vivid revelation of not only the tumultuous street life of Rome but also rituals of honour, the power and weakness of women, and the realities of social and economic hierarchies. Like cinema-verite, *Words and Deeds in Renaissance Rome* gives us an intimate glimpse of a people and their world.

The medieval landscape, as viewed through the eyes of scholars, was hardly populated by women. Particularly, young unmarried women or "maidens" have been paid little attention. This book aims to fill that gap by examining the meaning, experiences and voices of young womanhood. The life-phase of "adolescence" was different for maidens than for young men, and as such merits study in its own right. At the same time a study of young womanhood provides insights into ideals of feminine gender roles and identities at different social levels.

This investigation contributes to the existing scholarship on women and medicine in early modern Britain by examining the diagnosis and treatment of female patients by male professional medical practitioners from 1590 to 1740. In order to obtain a clearer understanding of female illness and medicine during this period, this study examines ailments that were specific and unique to female patients as well as illnesses and conditions that afflicted both female and male patients. Through a qualitative and quantitative analysis of practitioners' records and patients' writings - such as casebooks, diaries and letters - an emphasis is placed on medical practice. Despite the prevalence of females amongst many physicians' casebooks and the existence of sex-based differences in the consultations, diagnoses and treatments of patients, there is no evidence to indicate that either the health or the medical care of females was distinctly disadvantaged by the actions of male practitioners. Instead, the diagnoses and treatments of women were premised on a much deeper and more nuanced understanding of the female body than has previously been implied within the historiography. In turn, their awareness and appreciation of the unique features of female anatomy and physiology meant that male practitioners were sympathetic and accommodating to the needs of individual female patients during this pivotal period in British medicine.

Gender and Early Modern Constructions of Childhood JHU Press

Explores how structures of authority and relations of power were mediated at a grassroots level in early modern society. To this end, Hardwick examines the households of the families of men who worked as notaries in Nantes between 1560 and 1660. Focusing on daily interactions, she explores the early modern practice of patriarchy, which she
