If questions of subjectivity and identification are at stake in all biographical writing, they are particularly trenchant for contemporary women biographers of women. Often, their efforts to exhume buried lives in hope of finding spiritual foremothers awaken maternal phantoms that must be embraced or confronted. Do women writing in fact have any greater access to their own mothers' lives than to the lives of other women whose stories have been swept away like dust in the debris of the past? In *Thinking through the Mothers*, Janet Beizer surveys modern women's biographies and contemplates alternatives to an approach based in lineage and the form of thought that emphasizes the line, the path, hierarchy, unity, resemblance, reflection, and the aesthetic-mimesis-that depends on these ideas. Through close readings of memoirs and fictions about mothers, Beizer explores how biographers of the women who came before rehearse and rewrite relationships to their own mothers biographically as they seek to appropriate the past in a hybrid genre she calls "bio-autography." *Thinking through the Mothers* features the work of George Sand and Colette and spans such varied figures as Gustave Flaubert, Julian Barnes, Louise Colet, Eunice Lipton, Vladimir Nabokov, Huguette Bouchardeau, and Christa Wolf. Beizer seeks an alternative to women's "salvation biography" or "resurrection biography" that might resist nostalgia, be attentive to silence, and reinvent the means to represent the lives of precursors without appropriating traditional models of genealogy.

This book provides a theoretical assessment of audience research issues. A host of contributions from French-speaking scholars question and analyse the participatory turn in media and communication research that has emerged over the last 15 years. This collection brings together high-quality theoretical and empirical contributions in order to promote scientific discussions

and debates between English- and French-speaking academics. Ségur contextualizes the paradigmatic evolution of media communication, explaining how participation has become an imperative in media devices. In the first section authors explore, often critically, types of participatory media formats such as radio, television, and the internet. In the second section, authors focus on the participatory performances of audiences in public media spaces. Analysis is made of online forums, the phenomenon of lurking, and of urban spaces. This book provides viewpoints from a range of disciplines including social anthropology, information and communication sciences, and media studies.

La notion de public est à la fois familière, immédiate, mais aussi aléatoire et instable. Après tant d'années de recherche, nous n'en savons encore guère sur les publics; nous nageons dans les conjectures, nous traquons les définitions, les traces. Lui redonner l'épaisseur de la chronologie, retrouver les étapes de sa mise en scène, le prendre en quelque sorte par l'histoire, c'est s'interroger sur les "fables" qui le constituent, sur les injonctions qu'il produit en nombre. C'est tenter d'appréhender ces mille voix par lesquelles le public, les publics parlent, tant et si haut, de ce qu'il veut, ou ne veut pas, de ce qu'il fait, de ce qui est bon ou mauvais, pour lui, de ce qu'il aime... D'emblée, la notion de public est interrogée sur sa validité. Dès les premières recherches (dans les années 1930 pour les médias de masse) se pose la question de sa constitution comme collectif. Le public a-t-il affaire avec la chose politique ? Fait-il corps et peut-on lui supposer une communion, même minimale, de vues, de réactions, ou n'est-il que le produit imaginé d'une activité concomitante mais non commune ? La deuxième hypothèse n'a pas mené loin, mais pose explicitement la question de ce qui fait collectif dans une audience, et, plus complexe encore, des méthodes, des outils à forger pour l'appréhender. La première a nourri inquiétudes et mythologies. Comme la foule, le public peut paraître doté d'une force qui dépasse, menace, contrarie les pouvoirs, force que l'on peut dompter, mais alors au prix d'un travail énorme, de chaque instant. Muriel Favre en fait la démonstration avec les cérémonies du régime nazi. Une fois la notion admise, on tombe dans le

labyrinthe de ses définitions, dans la profusion de ses discours (Jérôme Bourdon). Le public est à la fois le résultat du travail des professionnels, une activité qui s'inscrit au milieu de mille autres, une représentation d'un collectif par lui-même, le résultat du travail des chercheurs et des historiens, un objet à mesurer, à vendre, à faire parler... Et puis la représentation du public, quelles que soient les multiples formes qu'elles revêtent (statistiques, psychologiques, historiques, professionnelles...), agrègent toujours des phénomènes différents, qui relèvent simultanément de ces différentes conceptions. L'objectif du Temps des Médias 3 n'est pas - qui le pourrait ? - de faire le tour de ces définitions, mais plutôt de proposer un panorama de différentes approches de ces questions, renouvelées par les derniers travaux de recherche, et qui, par delà des terrains et des conceptions différentes, nous interpellent.
