Wells invites readers to reflect on these eye-opening experiences of love and loss, both in The Hunger Games-and in readers' our own lives. Then, Jane Wells invites us to take action. The fictional world of Panem is full of inequality and desperation-and Katniss fights desperately to make her world better for everyone. Wells guides us through issues of social justice featured in The Hunger Games, inviting us to model our actions on Katniss Everdeen-and our faith.
