Here, on a white—not a high—horse, Susan Bielstein offers her decades of experience as an editor working with illustrated books. tried to reason with artists' estates in languages she doesn't speak, and who has spent her time in the archival trenches, she offers a snappy and humane guide to this difficult terrain. Filled with anecdotes, asides, and real courage, *Permissions, A Survival Guide* is a unique handbook that anyone working in the visual arts will find invaluable, if not indispensable.
