By contrasting rare successes, he finds a dozen broad lessons at the heart of these cautionary case studies. *Class Clowns* offers an important guide for public policy makers and guardrails for future investors, as well as an intelligent exposé for activists and teachers frustrated with the repeated underperformance of these attempts to shake up education.
