misses common to players who average about 19 to 22 points per dart, the resulting strategies are displayed in illustrations for each situation. At a glance, you can determine where you should aim to maximize your chance of winning. The optimal strategy for '01 games does not depend solely on your remaining score. The dart you are throwing (first, second, or third dart of your turn), your opponent's score, and your skill level should all factor into the decision of

where to aim. At times, the score you had at the beginning of your turn also matters if there is a possibility of busting. Even if you already have memorized a good out chart and always follow its recommendations, the strategies in this book can

yield more than a 2% increase in the proportion of legs that you win. That could mean winning one extra leg every couple of nights or several more legs over the course of a league season.
