Ventura at last elopes with her lover, an elderly nobleman. Gonzalo learns of her flight from the convent, in which the family have placed her, through the newspaper account, and commits suicide. Aside from the tragic love story, we have a series of entertaining episodes illustrating the jealousies and corrupt journalism of the provincial town. The proprietor of the newspaper, the rich codfish merchant, who spends his leisure time making wooden toothpicks and writing letters to the press, is an interesting type.
