He was sent from Spain on a religious crusade to Mexico to “detect the sickness of idolatry,” but Bernardino de Sahagún (c. 1499-1590) instead became the first anthropologist of the New World. The Franciscan monk developed a deep appreciation for Aztec culture and the Nahuatl language. In this biography, Miguel León-Portilla presents the life story of a fascinating man who came to Mexico intent on changing the traditions and cultures he encountered but instead ended up working to preserve them, even at the cost of persecution. Sahagún was responsible for documenting numerous ancient texts and other native

testimonies. He persevered in his efforts to study the native Aztecs until he had developed his own research methodology, becoming a pioneer of anthropology. Sahagún formed a school of Nahuatl scribes and labored with them for more than sixty years to transcribe the pre-conquest language and culture of the Nahuas. His rich legacy, our most comprehensive account of the Aztecs, is contained in his *Primeros Memoriales* (1561) and *Historia General de las Cosas de Nueva España* (1577). Near the end of his life at age 91, Sahagún became so protective of the Aztecs that when he died, his former Indian students and many others felt deeply affected. Translated into English by Mauricio J. Mixco, León-Portilla’s absorbing account presents Sahagún as a complex individual—a man of his times yet a pioneer in many ways.

A penicilina começou a ser importada com regularidade para Portugal a partir de Setembro de 1944. Foi a Cruz Vermelha Portuguesa que controlou criteriosamente a cedência e distribuição inicial da penicilina em Portugal. A partir de junho de 1945 o medicamento começou a ser importado e distribuído através da indústria farmacêutica. Nesta obra a autora analisando fontes de arquivo e impressas estudou a receção e importação da penicilina em Portugal e redigiu um estudo de

caso sobre os primeiros tratamentos realizados em Portugal nos Hospitais da Universidade de Coimbra. A autora mostra a atualidade de Portugal nesta matéria sobretudo no que respeita à importação do medicamento e na realização dos primeiros tratamentos. In September 1944, Portugal began to import a regular supply of penicillin from the US. The Portuguese Red Cross scrupulously controlled the supply distribution of the antibiotic. In 1945, as world production increased, penicillin began to be distributed through regular channels. The analysis of archive material concerning the reception and distribution of penicillin enabled the author to ascertain how they took place and present case study regarding the first treatments with the antibiotic in Portugal, in Coimbra University Hospitals.
