It is claimed that occurrences are less common today than in recent recorded history, and it is true that the frequency of some faults and taints being encountered in bottle has declined in the last decade or two. These include 'reduced' aromas, premature oxidation, atypical ageing and, very much on the rise, smoke taint.
