In his life and in his music, Cole Porter was the top—the pinnacle of wit and sophistication. From the 1910s through the '50s, from Yale pep rallies through the Broadway triumphs of *Anything Goes* and *Kiss Me, Kate*, he delighted audiences with a glittering torrent of song: "I Get a Kick Out of You." "Night and Day," "Love for Sale," and "Just One of Those Things." The bright surface of these gems—their catchy melodies and ingenious lyrics—made them instant pop hits. Their more subtle qualities and their musical and emotional depth have made them lasting standards, among the greatest glories of the American songbook. In Cole Porter, William McBrien has thoroughly captured the creator of these songs, whose life was one not only of wealth and privilege but also of tragedy, secrecy, and courage. A prodigal young man, Porter found his aesthetic and emotional anchor in a long, loving, if sexless marriage, while continuing to maintain many discreet affairs with men. In 1937, at the height of his success, he suffered a near-fatal riding accident; his last eighteen years were marked by pain, drugs, and repeated operations on his legs, years of physical agony but unstinting artistic achievement. Here is the book that Porter's fans have long hoped for—a life that informs the great music and lyrics though illuminating glimpses of the hidden, complicated, private man.

"From *Show Boat* (1936) to *The Sound of Music* (1965) and from *Grease* (1978) to *Chicago* (2002), many of the most beloved film musicals in Hollywood history originated as Broadway shows. And in the three years since the original publication of the chapters in this volume (as *The Oxford*

Handbook of Musical Theatre Screen Adaptations, 2019) the phenomenon has persisted, with new adaptations such as *Cats*, *In the Heights*, *Tick, Tick...Boom!*, *Dear Evan Hansen*, and Spielberg's remake of *West Side Story*. Yet in general, the number of screen adaptations of Broadway musicals and operettas is far greater than the number that have met with success, especially both critical and commercial success (i.e., good reviews and a profit at the box office). This is all the more surprising since Hollywood tended almost (if not quite) exclusively to buy the rights to musicals that had been successful on the stage as a means of guaranteeing a profitable outcome. After all, musicals that had already enjoyed long runs and nationwide productions on the stage ought to have a readymade audience. One might also think that because the authors had puzzled over the individual challenges posed by such properties in their stage incarnations, it ought to be easier to turn them into strong film musicals. But for every *West Side Story* there were several Finian's Rainbows, *Man of La Mancha*, and *Carousels*: movies that simply did not do justice to the 'enchanted evenings' these works provided in their stage incarnations"--

He also explores the changing structure of musical comedy and operetta, and the evolution of the role of the star. Fred Stone, the avuncular Scarecrow in the *Wizard of Oz*, seldom varied his acting from part to part; but the versatile Ethel Merman turned the headlining role inside out in *Gypsy*, playing a character who was selfish, fierce, and destructive. From "ballad opera" to burlesque, from *Fiddler on the Roof* to *Rent*, the history and lore of the musical unfolds here in a performance worthy of a standing ovation.
