The conquistador Hernán Cortés is dreaming of Tenochtitlan, the golden city of Aztecs. She shows him how to exploit the prophecy of the fabled god king's return to weaken Moctezuma's resolve and keep alive the suspicion that the conquistador might actually be Quetzalcoatl himself.
