Ezra Pound referred to 1922 as Year One of a new era. It was the year that began with the publication of James Joyce's *Ulysses* and ended with the publication of T. S. Eliot's *The Waste Land*, two works that were arguably "the sun and moon" of modernist literature, some would say of modernity itself. In *Constellation of Genius*, Kevin Jackson puts the
