The Javanese text being published here is not appearing in print for the first time: more than half a century ago it was published by B.J.O. Schrieke in his doctoral thesis *Ret Boek van Bonang* ("The Book of Bonang") (1916). In Schrieke's work, however, the emphasis fell on the historical introduction to the text rather than on the text itself, the edition of which is not free of shortcomings. Moreover, the analysis of the contents of the text appended to it could not make up for a complete translation. For the lack of a new edition and complete translation of this old and important text has not been made before now is due to the small number of scholars of Javanese - and the even smaller number of those among them who concern themselves with the Muslim works of Javanese literature.
