Later work into gravitational interactions between stars, the properties of fluids, magnetic fields, equilibrium ellipsoids, and black holes has earned him awards throughout the world, including the Gold Medal from the Royal Astronomical Society in London (1953), the National Medal of Science in the United States (1966), and the Copley Medal from the Royal Society (1984). His many publications include *Radiative*

*transfer* (1950), *Hydrodynamic and hydromagnetic stability* (1961), and *The mathematical theory of black holes* (1983), each being praised for its breadth and clarity.
