But schemes such as payments for environmental services (PES) depend on conditions, such as secure tenure, solid carbon data and transparent governance, that are often lacking and take time to change.

Many approaches to REDD+ now being considered are similar to previous efforts to conserve and better manage forests, often with limited success. Taking on board lessons learned from past

experience will improve the prospects of REDD+ effectiveness. National

institutional and policy mixes.

Uncertainties about the shape of the

future global REDD+ system, national

readiness and political consensus require flexibility and a phased approach to REDD+

implementation.

This book argues that social and environmental policy should be synthetically treated as one and the same field, that both are but two aspects of the same coin – if sustainability is the goal.

Such a paradigm shift is indicated, important, and timely to effectively move towards sustainability. This book is the first to take this approach and to give examples for it.
