What if meaning were the last thing that mattered in language?

In this essay, Henri Meschonnic explains what it means to translate the sense of language and how to do it.

In a radical stand against a hermeneutical approach based on the dualistic view of the linguistic sign and against its

separation into a meaningful signified and a meaningless signifier, Henri Meschonnic argues for a poetics of translating.
