Scénariste et dialoguiste à succès, écrivain qui nous a laissé des romans pleins de tendresse et d'humour, comme *La Guerre à neuf ans* (Grasset, 1971), Pascal Jardin (1934-1980) est non seulement une grande figure du cinéma et des lettres françaises des années 1960 et 1970, mais aussi un personnage faisant partie d'une mythologie entrée dans la mémoire collective des Français. Il a contribué à cette mythologie en racontant son histoire familiale dans plusieurs livres, et en est lui-même devenu le sujet quand son fils Alexandre l'a décrit dans *Le Zubial* (Gallimard, 1997) et dans *Le Roman des Jardin* (Grasset, 2005). Pascal est le fils de Jean Jardin, chef de cabinet de Pierre Laval sous Vichy. Très tôt, il développe un type de relation frénétique et passionné avec les

Il publie un premier roman à 23 ans (*Les Petits Malins*, 1957), puis devient un des grands talents du cinéma français, écrivant les scénarios ou les dialogues de films aussi célèbres que la série des Angélique (à partir d'*Angélique et le Roy*, 1966), mais aussi de véritables chefs-d'œuvre, comme *Le Chat*, avec Jean Gabin et Simone Signoret (1971) ou *Le Vieux fusil*, avec Philippe Noiret et Romy Schneider (1975). **Pascal Jardin** Grasset  
In 1907 Andre Gide began work on a series of Socratic dialogues on the subject of homosexuality and its place in society. These were published piecemeal, without the author's name, in private editions of twelve copies (1911) and twenty-one copies (1920) before a signed, commercial edition finally appeared in France in 1924. In his preface to the first American edition-- published in 1950, the year before his death-- Gide says: "Corydon remains in my opinion the most important of my books."

Modernist aesthetics

awakened a huge, highly diverse fascination with pantomime. The book explores an extraordinary variety of modernist and postmodern approaches to pantomime in Germany, Austria, France, numerous countries of Eastern Europe, Russia, Scandinavia, Spain, Belgium, The Netherlands, Chile, England, and The United States. Making use of many performance and historical documents never before included in pantomime histories, the book also discusses pantomime’s messy relation to dance, its peculiar uses of music, its “modernization” through

silent film aesthetics, and the extent to which writers, performers, or directors are “authors” of pantomimes. Just as importantly, the book explains why, more than any other performance medium, pantomime allows the spectator to see the body as the agent of narrative action.
