In the second half of the 1990s, Stuart Eizenstat was perhaps the most controversial U.S. foreign policy official in Europe. His mission had nothing to do with Russia, the Middle East, Yugoslavia, or any of the other hotspots of the day. Rather, Eizenstat's mission was to provide justice—albeit belated and imperfect justice—for the victims of World War II. Imperfect Justice is Eizenstat's account of how the Holocaust became a political and diplomatic battleground fifty years after the war's end, as the issues of dormant bank accounts, slave labor, confiscated property, looted art, and unpaid insurance policies convulsed Europe and America. He recounts the often heated negotiations with the Swiss, the Germans, the French, the Austrians, and various Jewish organizations, showing how these moral issues, shunted aside for so long, exposed wounds that had never healed and conflicts that had never been properly resolved. Though we will all continue to reckon with the crimes of World War II for a long time to come, Eizenstat's account shows that it is still possible to take positive steps in the service of justice.

Discusses coverage of the Eichmann trial in 1961 by the German press. There was a feeling of uncertainty and helplessness amongst German journalists regarding their capacity to deal with the trial without damaging the reputation of Germany throughout the world, as well as a reluctance to cope with German guilt. As the trial progressed, however, there was more of a willingness to confront the dark German past. Unlike the FRG, the DDR did not deal with the topic at that time but only accused West Germany of serving as a refuge for former Nazis. Argues that the capture of Eichmann and the trial proceedings were important building blocks for Germany's coming to terms with the past. Furthermore, during the 1950s-60s there was an evolution from refusal of remembrance, through an integrated commemoration policy, to coping with the Nazi crimes and the resulting responsibility and liability. The Eichmann trial was one of the stimuli which led to this trend.

So war er geplant und so nahm die Welt ihn wahr, weil der amerikanische Hauptankläger Robert Jackson nach den »Sternen eines neuen Völkerrechts« greifen und erstmals in der Geschichte Verbrechen gegen den Frieden bestraft sehen wollte. chapter including AlphaGo and AlphaGo Zero, Atari game playing, and IBM Watson's wagering strategy. The final chapter discusses the future societal impacts of reinforcement learning.

Compared to insects, fossil spiders have received only scant attention in the literature. Previously, the only works available were numerous scientific papers, many published in foreign languages. Most of these are basic descriptive taxonomic works, with very few considering broader biological concepts. Despite a significant increase in the discovery and description of fossil spiders within the last quarter Century this void remained unfilled. Thus, this short monograph aims to achieve several objectives. Firstly, to provide general and up to date background information on the overall importance and diversity of fossil spiders, including an indication of those groups for which the taxonomy is spurious and in need of reassessment. Secondly, to discuss the techniques available for working with fossil spiders and some of the problems encountered by palaeoarachnologists, including bias and limitations of the spider fossil record. Thirdly, the overall evolutionary history of spiders is summarized in the form of an evolutionary tree, which is subsequently used to address key issues of broad interest, such as origins, diversifications and extinctions, including the effects of mass extinctions and predator-prey co-radiations. Finally, the contribution that fossil data can make to understanding the past and present biogeography of the order is considered. This book should be of interest to both amateur and professional arachnologists and palaeontologists and will also serve as a general palaeontological reference work for neontologists studying extant spiders.

ABSTRACT In tune with the growing interest in prehistoric frontier zones in Europe, the present volume focuses on one of these marginal regions, on a white spot in the Early Neolithic of the Carpathian Basin. While the eastern and western areas of this region have been fairly well researched, the dense settlement network of the Körös culture in the heartland of the Carpathian Basin, on the alluvial plain of the Danube, has hardly ever been discussed. The fifty Körös sites identified during field surveys and described in detail, as well as the assessment of an old, unpublished excavation form the backbone of this volume alongside a complex analysis of the landscape and the vegetation, an assessment of the anthropological and

archaeozoological remains, as well as various archaeometric studies. The key issue discussed in the volume is the enigmatic behaviour of two neighbouring and genetically related northern Balkanic populations, namely the Körös and the Starčevo communities, which apparently had no archaeologically visible contact with each other. This issue is specifically relevant in the light of the spread of farming towards Central Europe: a process in which Starčevo groups played a decisive role, whilst the Körös groups did not. The southern Danube region in Hungary is one of the key areas where the shift to sedentism occurred and whence it spread towards Central Europe. In addition to a comprehensive summary of our present knowledge and an outline of the possible trajectories of future research, the book also addresses a set of new questions on the Neolithic transition. The author has been studying the cultural, genetic, cognitive and environmental changes in Neolithic for many decades. The other contributors to the volume provide detailed information on a series of related topics.

It is now an acknowledged fact in the world of linguistics that the concept of evaluation is crucial, and that there is very little – if any – discourse that cannot be analyzed through the prism of its evaluative content. This book presents some of the latest developments in the study of this phenomenon. Released more than a decade later than Hunston and Thompson's (2000) *Evaluation in Text, Evaluation in Context* is designed as its sequel, in an attempt to continue, update and extend the different avenues of research opened by the earlier work. The editors' main objective has been to gather contributions which investigate the manifold faces and phases of evaluation by presenting a wide variety of perspectives that include different linguistic theories (e.g. Axiological Semantics, Functionalism or Politeness Theory), different levels of linguistic description (e.g. phonological, lexical or semantic), and different text types and contexts (e.g. the evaluation found in ironic discourse, the multimodality of media discourse or the world of politics, just to name a few). The volume can be of use not only for scholars who study the evaluative function of language, but also for students who wish to pursue research in the area.

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
