often appearing as messengers from the underworld. Yet dwarfs and elves could be bargained with, and our ancestors would leave a broken object outside the door at night with the hope that a dwarf or elf (or other local spirit) would repair it. Revealing the true roots of these helpful and powerful beings, including an in-depth exploration of one of the most famous dwarf/elf/fairy beings of the Middle Ages, *Auberon* or *Oberon*, also known as *Alberich*, *Lecouteux* shows how the magic of dwarfs and elves can be rekindled if we recognize their signs and invite them back into our world.

young conductors in Leipzig in 1887. From then until Mahler's death in 1911—the year of the first performance of *Der Rosenkavalier*—they kept in touch.
