The first written version was published in Napoli by Giambattista Basile, in his Pentamerone. The story itself was based in the Kingdom of Naples, at that time the most important political and cultural center of Southern Italy and among the most influential capitals in Europe, and written in the Neapolitan dialect. It was later reprised, along with other Basile's tales, by Charles Perrault in *Histoires ou contes du temps passé*, and by the Brothers Grimm in their folk tale collection *Grimms' Fairy Tales*.
